# **Old Story - New Story**

This short article provides an excellent summary of the changing paradigm in education. Is it true that the role of teachers and learners is changing dramatically? Are the teachers of tomorrow trained in the principles of the "New Story?" Let's see.

Consider the author's principles which are summarized here:

OLD STORY	NEW STORY
Instruction is the focus	Learning is the responsibility of the learner
Students are passive	Students are active
Teachers are actors	Students are actors
Instruction "happens"	Learning "happens"
One-dimensional learning may occur	Multi-dimensional learning occurs
Limited attention to learning styles	Embrace multiple learning modalities
Lecture approach	Independent learning approach
Assessment by testing	Assessment of performance
Isolated learning	Peer collaboration
